- 3 On a motion by Johnnie H. Lyon, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court approved the removal of Ellan Tapp from the payroll of the County Clerk's Office effective December 31, 1974. All voting AYE.
- 4 On a motion of James A. Speight, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court voted to extend the contract of Mays and Company, Delinquent Tax Attorneys, for one (1) month from December 31, 1974. All voting AYE.
- 5 On a motion by Roy L. Holder, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court voted unanimously to set the second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Mondays of each month as Regular Sessions of the Commissioners' Court.

The Court discussed the purchase of a special binder for the Oaths of Office of Officials in order to preserve them in honor of this Country's Bi-Centennial. No action was taken at this time.

There being no further business, Judge Ed Terrell adjourned the meeting.
