

COMMISSIONER'S COURT MINUTES, APRIL 28, 1975

The Hunt County Commissioner's Court met in Regular Session, Monday, April 28, 1975 at 10:00 A.M. in the Commissioner's Courtroom, Hunt County Courthouse, Greenville, Texas with all members present and Judge Ed Terrell presiding.

Invocation was given by Commissioner Henry L. Grimes.

Minutes of the April 14, 1975 Regular Session and the April 21, 1975 Special Session were read and approved.

At this time the Hunt County Commissioner's Court was duly convened as a Board of Equalization for the Purpose of organization. Hunt County Clerk, Mrs. Bloom Johnson, administered the Oath to the members of the Board.

96 As there was no immediate business to be transacted by the Board of Equalization, Commissioner Henry L. Grimes moved the Board recess until 9:00 A.M., the 27th day of May, 1975, at which time the Board of Equalization will further resume the transaction of such business as may come before it. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Johnnie H. Lyon and carried with all members present voting AYE.

97 Commissioner Henry L. Grimes also moved the County Clerk be authorized to give notice of meeting of the Board of Equalization by publication in a newspaper published in Hunt County, Texas, for at least ten days prior to said meeting of said Board and to give individual notice to all tax payers whose properties are raised, if their addresses are known. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Johnnie H. Lyon and carried with all present voting AYE.

98 On a motion by Roy L. Holder, and seconded by James A. Speight, the Court granted the request of Mr. Henry Myers to lay a water line on the County Road in the area of the Kitsi Ridge and E-Z Living West Additions near Lake Tawakoni with the stipulation the line must be placed at least 30 inches deep and roads must be restored to as good or better condition than that prior to the laying of the line. Motion carried with all present voting AYE.

99 On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court granted right of way to Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in Commissioner Precinct 2 with the stipulation cables be placed on back slopes of roads and the County will not be responsible for damages done to roads. All members of the Court voting AYE.

100 On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court unanimously voted to temporarily pass on consideration of right of way requests by Continental Telephone of Texas until the County Attorney, Richard Carter, can meet with representatives of the Continental Telephone Co. and reach an agreement concerning follow up work to be done after the laying of cables.

101 On a motion by Johnnie H. Lyon, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court unanimously agreed the Texas Highway Department be allowed to place permanent bench markers on County right of way in Commissioner Precinct 1.

102 On a motion by James A. Speight, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court approved the removal of Mrs. Evon Weatherford from the payroll of the County Attorney's Office and the addition of Mrs. Gwen Adams at a salary of \$401.00 per month with all members present voting AYE.

103 Mrs. Marjorie Moore of the Child Welfare Department presented to the Commissioner's Court the need for a Child Welfare Board. Roy L. Holder moved the County Judge, Ed Terrell, and the County Attorney, Richard Carter, draw a contract agreement with the State of Texas for a Child Welfare Board. The contract to be presented to the Court for approval. The Motion was seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon and carried with all members of the Court voting AYE.

104 Commissioner James A. Speight made a motion to authorize Texas Power and Light Company to begin the relocation of electrical facilities along Farm Road 3218 south of Commerce with the County to reimburse Texas Power and Light for the cost of the relocation in the amount of \$14,297.00. Motion was seconded by Roy L. Holder and carried with all members present voting AYE.

105 On a motion by James A. Speight, seconded by Roy L. Holder, the Court authorized the transfer of \$60,000.00 from the Hunt County General Fund to the Hunt County Officers Salary Fund with all members present voting AYE.

106 On a motion by James A. Speight, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court approved the Hunt County Portion of the Hunt County Health Department budget in the amount of \$15,066.00 and authorized Judge Terrell to sign the complete budget with all members present voting AYE.

107 On a motion by Roy L. Holder, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court voted unanimously to renew the annual contract with the Soil Conservation Service for the July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976 Term.

108 On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by James A. Speight, the Court voted to accept as official, the returns of the April 22, 1975 Special State Constitutional Amendment Election. All members of the Court voting AYE.

There being no further business, Judge Ed Terrell adjourned the Court.
