COMMISSIONER'S COURT MINUTES, AUGUST 25, 1975

The Hunt County Commissioner's Court met in Regular Session, Monday August 25, 1975 at 10:00 am. in the Commissioner's Courtroom, Hunt County Courthouse, Greenville, Texas with all members present and Judge Ed Terrell presiding

Invocation was given by County Judge Ed Terrell.

Minutes of the August 11, 1975 Regular Session were read and approved.

- 175 On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by Roy L. Holder, the Court voted to close an abandoned road in Commissioner Precinct 2 in the Union Hill area in Order to allow soil conservation work in the area. A petition requesting the chosing of the road and bearing the signatures of eleven property owners in the area was presented to the Court by Judge Terrell. Motion carried with all members of the Court voting AYE.
- 176 On a motion by James A. Speight, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court unanimously voted to consolidate election boxes for the November Special Constitutional Election as follows: Boxes 2 and 29 will vote at Box 1 in Greenville; Boxes 5A and 12 will vote at Box 5 in Greenville; Box 7 will vote at Caddo Mills; Boxes 21 and 23 will vote at Box 9 in Greenville; Boxes 8, 24, 32 and 34 will vote at Box 10 in Quinlan; Box 11 will vote at Lone Oak; Box 14 will vote at Box 17 in Campbell; Box 19 will vote at Wolfe City; Box 4 will vote at Box 26 in Geleste; Voxes 15, 16, 18, 30, and 31 will vote in Box 33 in Commerce; and Box 35A will vote at Box 35 in Green-oville; and Box 36 will be designated for Absentee voting.
- 177 On a motion by Roy L. Holder, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court approved tax Certificates of Correction numbers 1401-1408 with all members of the Court voting AYE.
- 178 Motion was made by James A. Speight, and seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon to continue the em-ployment of Ann Gray in the County Tax Office through the month of Se ptember. Motion carried with all members of the Court voting AYE.
- 179 On a motion by Johnnie H. Lyon, seconded by Henry L. Grimes, the Court unanimously voted to allow Veterans Service Officer, Charles Beene to attend a four day conference in Dallas on September 8, 1975.

- /80 Motion was made by Roy L. Holder, and Seconded by James A. Speight to allow County Attorney Richard W. Carter to attend the Attorney General's Law Enforcement Conference in Austin on September 4, 1975. Motion was a proved with all members of the Court voting AYE.
- /8/ On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court voted to remove Anthony Feele from the County payroll as building custodian effective August 15, 1975 and to add Mr. A. O. Monk as custodian effective August 22, 1.975 at \$436.00 per month, with all members present voting AYE.
- 182 On a motion by Johnnie H. Lyon, seconded by Roy L. Holder, the Court passed the following resolution with all members voting AYE: "RESOLVED: that the road running from Farm to Market Road 36 easterly and then northerly known as the Old CountyRoad and serving the Tom Cordner land in the J. S. Bond Survey, and other land, is and has been for many years a part of the Hunt County Road System."
- 183 Motio n was made by James A. Speight, and seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon to approve the following: "BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Commissioners Court of Hunt County, Texas, that it authorize the NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNME.NTS to make the necessary changes of an original resolution concerning IAW ENFORCEMENT RADIO COMMUNICATIO.NS EQUIPMENT. The amount authorized should be changed from \$8,349.91 to an amount of \$9,285.41." The change was due to the addition of two mobile units and an extra remote control unit. Motion carried with all members voting AYE.

Mr. Weldon Money appeared before the Court concerning possible compensation for injuries his wife received in the Courthouse. Judge Terrell told Mr. Money the Court was sorry about Mrs. Money's accident but did not feel the County was negligent and could not be responsible for her injury.
