PUBLIC HEARING, SE-PTEMBER 22, 1975

Monday, September 22, 1975 Judge Ed Terrell reconvened the Court at 11:20 A.M. with all members present for the purpose of considering ap proval of the 1975-1976 Hunt County Budget.

Sheriff Wayne Green, District Attorney Jerry Davis and Adult Probation Officer Billy Haddock sopke to the Court concerning the needs in the jail.

There being no agreement reached by the Court, Judge Terrell recessed the Budget Hearing Until 1:30 P.M.

The Hunt County Commissioner's Court Budget Hearing reconvened at 1:30 P.M. in the Commissioner's Courtroom with all members present and Judge Ed Terrell presiding.

County Attorney Richard W . Carter spoke to the Court co ncerning the Law Library.

Mrs. Marjie Glover, Director of the Voluntary Action Center, and Mrs. Bill Rusk, Director of the Hunt County Council on Alcoholism told the Court of operations of their respective agencies and the need for funding.

206 Following further discussion, a motion was made by James A. Speight and seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon to approve the budget for 1975-1976 based on the tax rate of 80¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation to be divided among the following funds as follows: Jury Fund-7¢, Road and Bridge-16¢, General Fund-44¢, Permanent Improvement-6¢, Hunt County Right of Way Warrants 1970 Issue-1¢ and Permanent Improvement Warrants 1973 Issue-1¢. It is also stipulated that the four additional jailers proposed for the Sheriff's Department be deleted from the budget and the Sheriff will be allowed the purchase of three new vehicles rather than four as proposed in the budget. Notion carried with Commissioners Johnnie H. Lyon, Henry L. Grimes, Roy L. Holder and James A. Speight voting AYE and Judge Ed Terrell voting No.

The 1975-1976 budget being approved, Judge Ed Terrell adjourned the Court.

Following the close of business members of the Court made a tour of the jail with Sheriff Wayne Green. Minutes read and approved this the law day of like 1975.
