

COMMISSIONERS COURT MINUTES, MARCH 8, 1976

The Hunt County Commissioners Court met in regular session, Monday, March 8, 1976 at 10:00 A.M. in the Commissioners Courtroom, Hunt County Courthouse, Greenville, Texas with all members present and Judge Ed Terrell presiding.

Invocation was given by Commissioner Henry L. Grimes.

**305** the only bid received on a wrecked 1974 Dodge offered for sale was a bid of \$227.50 from J W Motors of Route 3, Greenville. Motion was made by Roy L. Holder and seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon to accept the bid and allow J W Motors to purchase the wrecked 1974 Dodge at a price of \$227.50. Motion carried with all members of the Court voting AYE.

**306** As a Matter of "Old Business", a motion was made by Johnnie H. Lyon and seconded by James A. Speight to authorize the payment of a bill from Drs. Dyll and Dyll in the amount of \$225.00 for treatment of George Lauderdale with the stipulation this will be the final payment by Hunt County on this account.

**307** Motion was made by James A. Speight and seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon to accept the Texas Highway Department's 1980 Rural Functional Classification and the Federal Aid-Urban System & Urban Area Boundary programs. Motion carried with all members of the Court voting AYE.

Matching funds for the Pilot Grove Maintenance Fund had already been approved and no action was required by the Court.

Ms. Tina Lux, representing Mr. Irwin S. Bahl who is Health Planning Associate for the North Texas Council of Governments, made a presentation to the Court on Emergency Medical Services systems and asked the Court for Support for this program. No action was taken on this date, however, Judge Terrell told Ms. Lux he would discuss the program with local agencies that would be involved.

308 On a motion by Henry L. Grimes, seconded by Johnnie H. Lyon, the Court unanimously approved a right of way request by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in Commissioner Precinct 2 with the stipulation cables be placed on back slopes of roads and the County will not be responsible for damages done to cables as a result of maintenance of roads and any damage done to roads as a result of the laying of cable must be repaired to as good or better condition than that of the road before the laying of cable.

309 On a motion by James A. Speight, seconded by Roy L. Holder, the Court approved accounts for the month of February, 1976 with all members of the Court voting AYE. Balance of accounts is as follows:

Judge Ed Terrell recessed the Court until 1:30 P.M. in order to meet with representatives of the Texas Highway Department.

Court reconvened at 1:30 P.M. in the Law Library on the third floor of the Hunt County Courthouse, Greenville, Texas with Commissioners Henry L. Grimes, Roy L. Holder, and James A. Speight present and Judge Ed Terrell presiding. Commissioner Johnnie H. Lyon was absent.

Robert S. Thornburrow, G. L. Hall, and Harry Short from the Texas Highway Department met with the Court to discuss Farm-to-Market road programs in Hunt County and to ask what the Court considered to be a priority project. Members of the Court were in agreement that the next project requested by Hunt County would be a Farm-to-Market road from Clinton to State Highway 66 in Commissioner Precinct 2.

There being no further business, Judge Ed Terrell adjourned the Court.
