-000-EMERGENCY SESSION OCTOBER 23, 1995

Following adjournment of the Regular Session, it was brought to the Court's attention by the Auditor's Office, that the bid which was accepted for the four patrol cars (Ref. Order #6075) was invalid because the autos were 1995 models and the bid specs called for 1996 models.

6087 A motion was then made by Judge Bobbitt, second by Jim Hart, to rescind order #6075. Approved on unanimous vote. 6088 The Auditor's Office told the Court that Orange Ford-Lincoln-Mercury submitted a second bid for four 1996 Crown Victoria patrol cars at a bid price of \$73,042. This bid was under the bid price of \$76,724 submitted by Greenville Ford-Lincoln-Mercury. On the motion by Bobbitt, second by Hart, the Court accepted the second bid from Orange.

The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00 mam in the Commissioners Courtroom with Joe Bobbitt presiding and Commissioners Green, Hart, and Martin present.
