

COMMISSIONERS COURT
REGULAR SESSION
May 24, 2004

The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00A.M. with all Commissioners present with Judge Joe Bobbitt presiding. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as submitted.

OLD BUSINESS:

9107 On the motion by Ralph Green, second by Kenneth Thornton, the Court approved granting a provisional deed (with a 1 year stipulation) to the Noon Rotary Club to the County owned property located on Lee Street (old post office) to allow time for this group to determine whether or not this building would be feasible to be used for public use of Greenville and Hunt County. The Court stressed the liabilities involved with this building and this additional time would allow this service organization time to consider all cost involved. This would make the Noon Rotary Club responsible for the insurance, maintenance and utilities of this building. Jeff Spindle, Larry Green Jr., Bill Ralson and James Handley were all present in Court for this discussion. For: Thornton, Green, Latham. Against: Martin. Motion carries. *See Attachments.*

NEW BUSINESS:

9108 On the motion by Phillip Martin, second by Green, the Court approved the following resale properties for sale: R27116, R71553 and R71907. *See Attachment.*

9109 On the motion by Judge Bobbitt, second by Jim Latham, the Court approved Resolution in support of program from Youth Out Of Control Task Force to help bring the community, school district and families together to address students who are consistently disruptive. Aida Collin – Title 1 Co-ordinator and William Smith – Superintendent of Greenville Schools advised the Court this program would stress parent involvement, school programs and community support programs teaching character development and meaningful consequences. Also present was Sgt. Petrea of Greenville PD and Patrick Just of the Greenville Alternative School. *See Attachment.*

9110 On the motion by Martin, second by Green, the Court approved Resolution for the Hunt County Boys and Girls Club to apply for grant funding. Request presented by David Lavasser. *See Attachment.*

— ‘Discuss and possibly take action on validity of the City of Caddo Mills Local Option Liquor Petition: Almina Cook:’ After much discussion concerning the petition, Ms. Cook advised the Court out of a total of 104 names on the petition, 79 were valid, the statute required a total of at least 87 valid signatures. The Court concluded the petition was not valid, due to the lack of required signatures. Judge Bobbitt stated no further action required by the Court. *See Attachment.*

9111 On the motion by Martin, second by Latham, the Court approved request of FEC Electric to construct electrical power distribution facilities along and across CR 3212 in Pct 3 with the usual stipulations.

9112 On the motion by Green, second by Martin, the Court approved request of FEC Electric to construct electrical power distribution facilities along and across CR2526 in Pct 2 with the usual stipulations.

9113 On the motion by Green, second by Martin, the Court approved approximately 2,000 ft of dirt to rock road upgrade on CR2595 in Pct 2. Money deposited into Escrow account.

9114 On the motion by Green, second by Martin, the Court approved proposal for financing computer hardware and software for the offices of the County Treasurer and County Auditor from 1st Continental of Hattiesburg, Mississippi at 3.19% rate for 5 years.

9115 On the motion by Thornton, second by Martin, the Court approved bid received from Recycled Aggregates in Arlington, TX. for recycled asphalt. Bid on file in the Personnel Office.

9116 On the motion by Green, second by Martin, the Court approved bid for chip rock for seal coating from Cook County Stone. Bid on file in the Personnel Office.

Dear James Handley,

Thank you for the opportunity to work with you in evaluating the former Post Office building located at King St. and Lee St. in Greenville. I have inspected the building and interviewed City officials who occupied the building for several years. The building is one of the most substantial buildings in the area and has been well maintained.

General Condition of Building

- Standing seam roof is in excellent condition. Built-up roof around perimeter shows some age, but should last several more years.
- Exterior masonry is sound, and joint mortar is essentially intact. There are several joints in the stone coping atop the parapet walls that should be tuck-pointed, but the cost would be minimal. A few of the limestone panels on the building have surface spalling. This is a cosmetic rather than a structural issue, and should require no repair work. A small section of cast stone decorative cap has fallen from the east side of the building. I find no evidence of other pieces loosened or likely to fall. The fallen piece of cast stone can be replicated as budget allows.
- The concrete paving behind the building was designed for truck traffic and should last for decades as a parking lot. Sidewalks and steps are sound, with an expected amount of cracking and spalling. A handicap ramp has been added at the rear of the building, and appears to be ADA compliant. The public sidewalk ramp in front of the building is out of compliance with ADA, but this is a municipal rather than a private issue. There is an area on the east side where concrete pads have settled as much as 4 inches. I expect the fill beneath the pads has washed away over the years. These pads are not part of the driveway, so the settlement is not a safety issue.
- The original wooden windows are in fair shape. A few may need sash repair, and all need re-glazing and painting. As budget permits, the windows could be replaced with vinyl-clad thermo-pane windows. All entrance doors are in good shape.

- Portions of the interior have been remodeled over the years, but much of the original pine woodwork is unchanged. The terrazzo floors are in good shape. In general, the interior finishes are acceptable, but new paint and carpet in certain areas would greatly enhance the working environment
- The chilled water and heating systems are in good working order, and all plumbing functions well.
- The electrical system appears to be code compliant, adequate, and safe. Additional communications wiring may be needed in the future for office networking.

In general, I think the building is one of the finest older buildings in the downtown area. The cost of incidental repairs required to occupy the building should be less than \$40,000. If you need further information, please call.

The Greenville Noon Rotary Club has been exploring the feasibility of acquiring the Old Post Office Building on Lee Street in Downtown Greenville. The Rotary Club believes the citizens of Hunt County would be well served by the Club's plan to restore the Building's interior to its historic appearance.

If the Club acquires the Building, civic organizations in Greenville and Hunt County could utilize the Building for meeting space. The Building would also be attractive to the general public for meetings, parties and receptions.

The Club needs at least six months to determine the feasibility of renovating the Building. The Club recognizes the desire of the Commissioner's Court to alleviate the burden of maintaining the Building. For that reason, the Club is requesting the Court to enter into an Option Agreement with the Club whereby the Club would be granted exclusive right to purchase the Building for a period of six months (the "Option Period"). During the Option Period, the Club would assume all liability for insurance, utilities and other maintenance expenses, thereby relieving the County of those expenses.

The Club would take possession of the Building and would be allowed to alter the Building in a way that is consistent with its historic appearance. This would mean, for instance, that the interior walls constructed for the County's use as office space could be removed by the Club during the Option Period. The Club would also have sole discretion to regulate the electric and water usage at the Building during the Option Period in order to minimize the cost of utilities during the feasibility stage.

If the Club determines that renovating the Building is not feasible, the Club would have the right to return possession to the County. If possession of the Building is returned to the County, the Option Agreement would terminate and the County would be free to

Our objectives are to gain funding from COG (1) mobilize community resources to combat juvenile delinquency (2) reach out to over 300 at-risk youth and/or 75 youth already involved with the Juvenile Justice System in Hunt County (3) promote positive developmental experiences for youth by implementing interest-based programs (e.g., literacy, health, conflict resolution skills, employment skills, social services, vocational) that addresses the youth's specific needs as well as boosting the youth's overall moral (4) provide individualized case management across four areas (law enforcement/juvenile justice, school, family and club) to target youth to decrease juvenile-related behaviors and contact with the juvenile justice system, and to increase the likelihood that they will attend school and show improved academic success.

Project Summary

Description of Project

In the absence of strategies developed to work with more severely hard core youth, strategies that provide them with the types of positive supports and opportunities they need as much as other youth, while at the same time dealing with the harder issues they bring to the table (e.g., drug problems, academic problems, dealings with the justice system), the funding poured into after-school programs is going to miss these hard-to-reach youth.

In keeping with OJJDP's Comprehensive Community-Wide Model, Boys & Girls Club will implement the Partnering for Youth Project—a two initiative approach (a) **prevention**—to help youth avoid a delinquent lifestyle, (b) **intervention**—to help youth get away from their delinquent-associated behaviors and values.

Prevention Programs are designed to attract a majority of youth that are high-risk of juvenile involvement based on such indicators as their level of association with negative peers, poor academic histories, and prior involvement in illegal and delinquent activities.

Intervention Programs are designed to attract majority of youth whom are already juvenile delinquent or demonstrating delinquent behaviors.

PY Project will be critical to successful youth development; and provide opportunities that youth may not have received in other realms of their lives. Without the PY Project youth may continue to seek similar experiences through delinquency involvement.

Boys & Girls Clubs provide an optimal setting for implementing PY Project prevention and intervention approaches. Because local Boys & Girls Clubs have existed in many of their communities for decades, they have a history and experience serving youth who are disengaged from school, have been in trouble, and are not connected to positive supports and resources. Boys & Girls Clubs provide an existing infrastructure in terms of staffing, funding and facilities.

Boys & Girls Club will collaborate with a network of community agencies (School District, University, Juvenile Court System, Corrections Department, Families, Social Services, Counseling Services, Health Services, Employers, City, & County) to bring agencies together around a common mission of preventing and intervening against youth's involvement in delinquency. The collaboration will make it easier for the agencies to wrap the services around the youth, rather than expect the youth to be able to get transportation to multiple needed services, such as for job training, GED, and drug and alcohol treatment, etc.... Other possible service providers will be able to come on site to work with youth. The Boys & Girls Clubs' facility and the fact that the programming will be primarily place-based provide to multiple opportunities for integration and cooperative provision of services.

This Project will enable the Boys & Girls Club to expand services to the Juvenile Detention Detainees in terms of wider variety of services & increase length of services.

2. 25 percent of the registered voters in the political subdivision who voted in the most recent general election for a ballot issue that permits voting for or against "The legal sale of wine on the premises of a holder of a winery permit."
3. 35 percent of the registered voters in the subdivision who voted in the most recent gubernatorial election for an election on any other ballot issue.

E. Are "Suspense List" voters included in the total numbers of signatures required for a valid petition? [Sec. 251.11]

No. House Bill 1199 specifically provides that "Suspense List" or "S-List" voters are not included in the total number of signatures.

F. Who determines the total number of registered voters?

The determination of the total number of registered voters required for purposes of calculating the number of signatures required on a local option liquor petition is made in accordance with the official records of the voter registrar. Although the Code does not provide a definition of the current list of registered voters, our office contends that the current list used for verifying signatures should be the official list which exists on the date that the petitions were issued to the petitioners.

G. What constitutes a valid signature? [Sec. 251.10]

1. 1. No signature may be counted unless the signatures:
 - a. a. contain, in addition to the signature:
 - i. i. the signer's printed name;
 - ii. ii. the signer's date of birth;
 - iii. iii. if the territory from which signatures must be obtained is situated in more than one county, the county of registration;
 - iv. iv. the signer's residence address; and
 - v. v. the date of signing;
 - b. b. comply with any other applicable requirements prescribed by law.
2. 2. the signature is the only requirement that must be in the signer's own hand writing.

H. Who is a registered voter for purpose of signing a local option liquor petition? (Sec. 251.10 & 13.143, Texas Election Code)

A signer must have an effective voter registration in the political subdivision in which the petition is being circulated.

I. What constitutes a valid residence address?

(d) The omission of the state from the signer's residence address does not invalidate a signature unless the political subdivision from which the signature is obtained is situated in more than one state. The omission of the zip code from the address does not invalidate a signature.

(e) The signature is the only entry on the petition that is required to be in the signer's handwriting.

(f) A signer may withdraw the signer's signature by deleting the signature from the petition or by filing with the registrar of voters an affidavit requesting that the signature be withdrawn from the petition. A signer may not withdraw the signature from a petition on or after the date the petition is received by the registrar of voters. A withdrawal affidavit filed by mail is considered to be filed at the time of its receipt by the registrar of voters. The withdrawal of a signature nullifies the signature on the petition and places the signer in the same position as if the signer had not signed the petition.

Sec. 251.11. REQUIREMENTS TO ORDER ELECTION. (a) The [Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (c), the] commissioners court, at its next regular session on or after the 30th day after the date the petition is filed, shall order a local option election to be held on the issue set out in the petition if the petition is filed with the registrar of voters not later than the 60th day [30 days] after the date the petition [it] is issued and bears [in the actual handwriting of the signers the following:]

[(+) the actual signatures of a number of qualified voters of the political subdivision equal to:

(1) 35 percent of the registered voters in the subdivision for a ballot issue that permits voting for or against:

(A) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only.";

(B) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages, except mixed beverages.";

(C) "The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages."; or

(D) "The legal sale of mixed beverages.";

(2) 25 percent of the registered voters in the subdivision who voted in the most recent general election for a ballot issue that permits voting for or against "The legal sale of wine on the premises of a holder of a winery permit."; or

(3) 35 percent of the registered voters in the subdivision who voted in the most recent gubernatorial election for an election on any other ballot issue [a notation showing the residence address of each of the signers; and]

[(3) each signer's voter registration certificate number].

(d) Voters whose names appear on the list of registered voters with the notation "S." or a similar notation, shall be excluded from the computation of the number of registered voters of a particular territory.

NOTE: Sec. 251.11(b) and (c) repealed by House Bill 1199, 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003.

Sec. 251.12. RECORD IN MINUTES. The date a petition is presented, the names of the signers, and the action taken with respect to the petition shall be entered in the minutes of the commissioners court.

Sec. 251.13. ISSUES TO APPEAR IN ORDER FOR ELECTION. (a) The order for the election shall state in its heading and text whether the local option election to be held is for the purpose of prohibiting or legalizing the sale of the alcoholic beverages set out in the issue recited in the application and petition.

(b) The order shall state the issue to be voted on in the election.

Sec. 251.14. ISSUES. (a) In the ballot issues prescribed in this section, "wine" is limited to vinous beverages that do not contain more than 17 percent alcohol by volume and includes malt beverages that do not exceed that alcohol content. For local option purposes, those beverages, sold and dispensed to the public in unbroken, sealed, individual containers, are a separate and distinct type of alcoholic beverage.

(b) In areas where any type or classification of alcoholic beverages is prohibited and the issue submitted pertains to legalization of the sale of one or more of the prohibited types or classifications, the ballot shall be prepared to permit voting for or against one of the following issues:

(1) "The legal sale of beer for off-premise consumption only."
