3,700 ft of road upgrade of dirt to rock on CR4801 in Pct 4. Money deposited into Escrow Account

— 'Discuss and possibly take action on time keeping policy:' Brenda Cook from Payroll Department advised the Court we can't tie paper time sheets and electronic time records together on existing software. All offices need to be on same system, once this is done, the software company will implement the proper program. Currently, the County Clerk, Sheriff's Department, Maintenance Department, Veterans Service Office and Payroll Department are interested in installation of this service. Judge Bobbitt suggested we inter into a pilot program until all offices are on system. Monies (\$11,657.95) have already been allocated, software has been purchased, no contract / no maintenance cost, with Technical support of \$425.00. This system will make all employees accountable, which the taxpayers are paying for. The Commissioners Court can set a time keeping policy for all County employees. After much discussion, Judge Bobbitt appointed an adhoc committee made up of Commissioner Green and Commissioner Martin to work on time keeping policy and total cost involved. Placed on <u>OLD BUSINESS</u> in 2 weeks.

The Court also noted the only people allowed to authorized an expenditure is Command and Control – Judge Bobbitt, Dorsey Driggers, Karen Daily, Kenny Ward.

Bobby Harper – Chairman of Historical Society in Caddo Mills presented a \$3,000 check for Katrina Fund.

David Mitanich of 1st Southwest Company addressed the Court on possibility of buying down (refinancing) the note on the Hunt County Jail, with an estimated savings of \$420,000.00 in interest alone, based on rates at this point. Judge stated we have one opportunity to take advantage on the Bond.

Commissioner Latham discussed the old Esco Building being used as storage for old tires, currently we have approximately 10,000 tires. We need to set a policy, due to the safety issues if there was a fire, by appointing an adhoc committee to evaluate situation. Judge Bobbitt suggested Commissioner Latham and Commissioner Thornton serve on this Committee.
