COMMISSIONERS COURT REGULAR SESSION

October 10, 2005

The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00A.M.with all Commissioners present with Judge Joe Bobbitt presiding. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as submitted.

OLD BUSINESS:

9577 On the motion by Ralph Green, second by Kenneth Thornton, the Court approved bids for Asphalt hot and cold from different originating points. Bids on file in Personnel Office.

9578 On the motion by Judge Bobbitt, second by Green, the Court approved a 3 year bid for Uniform Rental from Aramark, based on information submitted to Court. Bid on file in Personnel Office.

NEW BUSINESS:

9579 On the motion by Green, second by Phillip Martin, the Court approved Resolution concerning the old Post Office, located at 2820 Lee and King Street, conveying this property to the Greenville Rotary Post Office Foundation. Judge Bobbitt stated the County put Deed Restrictions on the original conveyance, to see if this group could take over property and make it a viable property, which they have accomplished.

Furthermore, this building has been utilized on a regular basis by local civic organizations based in Hunt County within one year of the date of the Deed. See Attachment.

9580 On the motion by Martin, second by Jim Latham, the Court approved accounts payable issues on reimbursable bills and a part time employee (4 hours per day at \$10.00 per hour) to assist Diane McNair for the Katrina Relief Program, in addition, authorized County Treasurer – Delores Shelton to sign reimbursement checks. Judge Bobbitt advised the Court of the first FEMA reimbursement funding coming to Hunt County.

9581 On the motion by Green, second by Latham, the Court approved salvage bid of \$100 for 1989 Oldsmobile from Sheriff's Department seizure. Jimmy Moore advised the Court he had received a letter of authorization from the District Attorney's Office and Sheriff's Office.

9582 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton the Court approved to advertise for the FY 2005-2006 Rock, Rock Hauling, Janitorial Supplies, Premixed Oil and Sand, Recycled Asphalt Hauling, Recycled Asphalt, Recycled Concrete, Box Culverts, Gas Card Reader, Clear Span Bridges 20, 30, and 40 feet, Metal Sheets and Steel Culverts, Road Oil, Fuel and Lubricants, Copier Maintenance, Seal Coat Emulsion, Rock used with Seal Coat, Asphalt Hot and Cold.

9583 On the motion by Martin, second by Green, the Court approved to advertise and SELL for the FY 2005-2006, permission to sell one or more motorgraders, one or more truck tractors, one or more pick up trucks, one or more trailers (belly dump, rock trailers, etc.) one or more back hoes, mowers or wheel loaders for all Precincts, Maintenance and Environmental Enforcement.

9584 On the motion by Thornton, second by Green, the Court approved permission to advertise and BUY for FY 2005-2006, permission to buy one or more motorgraders, one or more truck tractors, one or more pick up trucks, one or more trailers (belly dump, rock trailers, etc.) one or more back hoes, mowers or wheel loaders for all Precincts, Maintenance and Environmental Enforcement.

9585 On the motion by Green, second by Martin, the Court accepted all bids received on Rock from Smith Butler Crushed Stone, Rock Solid and Armour Materials, with different originating locations. Bids on file in Personnel Office.

9586 On the motion by Thornton, second by Latham, the Court accepted bids for Rock Hauling from Gandy's Transport LLC and Robert Templeton. Bids on file in the Personnel Office.

9587 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved request of FEC Electric to construct electrical power distribution facilities along and across CR2509 in Pct 2, with the usual stipulations.

9588 On the motion by Martin, second by Latham, the Court approved request of FEC Electric to construct electrical power distribution facilities along and across CR3520 in Pct 3, with the usual stipulations.

9589 On the motion by Latham, second by Martin, the Court approved request of FEC Electric to construct electrical power distribution facilities along and across CR4209 in Pct 4, with the usual stipulations.

9590 On the motion by Thornton, second by Green, the Court approved replat of Lot 4 in Redbud Estates in Pct 1.

9591 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved Preliminary
Plat for Harvest Bend Estates in Pct 2, with developer Cliff Jones to do an upgrade on the
County Road, and to build 4 cul-de-sac concrete streets.

9592 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved the Final Plat for Branden Maner Phase – Three in Pct 2, presented by Frank Owens. Commissioner Green stated drainage plan received and Road Bond in place. Mr. Owens specified County Roads to be built with seal coat with bar ditches.

9593 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved Amended Final Plat for Oak Creek Estates in Pct 2. Commissioner Green explained to the Court there were Engineering discrepancies on some lots and this amendment was done to correct dimensions.

9594 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved the Preliminary Plat for Oak Creek Estates Phase II in Pct 2

— 'Discuss and possible take action on minimum bid received on resale property purchase for R41908. Minimum bid of \$175.00 submitted by Stacey A. Wuyts – Kaye Abbott, Tax Office:' Item dropped from the Agenda.

9595 On the motion by Martin, second by Latham, the Court approved minimum bid received on resale property purchase for R72863 located 2923 Bourland Street.

Minimum bid of \$175,000.00 submitted by Stacey Wuyts. Court approved on Tax

Assessor recommendation. Deed to be filed in Official Public Records.

9596 On the motion by Latham, second by Martin, the Court approved minimum bid on resale property purchase for R44391 located on 4700 Cordell Street. Minimum bid of \$2,945.50 submitted by Karen Houston Swartz. Court approved on the recommendation of the Tax Assessor. Deed to be filed in Official Public Records.

9597 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court approved minimum bid on resale property purchase for R53775, located on CR2552 in Cash area. Minimum bid of \$360.03 submitted by Gbenga Bada. Court approved on recommendation of the Tax Assessor. Deed to be filed in Official Public Records.

9598 On the motion by Judge Bobbitt, second by Green, the Court approved increase in CCRMF from \$5.00 to \$7.50 and RMF from \$20 to \$22.50 on each criminal conviction of any offense occurring on or after 9-1-05, per approval of SB 526 enacted through the 79th Legislative Session. This bill also repeals the definition of Records Archive (CCRAF) as public documents filed with the County Clerk before January 1, 1990. Therefore, repealing the expiration date of 9-1-08 on collection of County Clerks Records Archive Fee (CCRAF). County Clerk Linda Brooks stated our plan will remain the same as originally approved by the Court 3 years ago, which was to image our plats into a database to allow printing of all our plats, now we will be able to use our CCRAF to image all Hunt County Plats. See Attachment.

HEAR AND DISCUSS:

Commissioner Green ask the Court for permission for the County to buy additional ROW to allow room to work due to construction on Hwy 276, with TxDot to do all the fill work, paving and metal culverts. Judge Bobbitt suggested if this makes Hwy 276 a safer road for our citizens to drive on, we should buy the ROW. Consensus of the Court was to purchase this additional ROW. Court noted road to be closed approximately 1 year, which we implement use of other roads to divert traffic.

9599 On the motion by Martin, second by Latham, the Court approved accounts payable. Judge Bobbitt abstained from the vote.
