

**COMMISSIONERS COURT

The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00 A.M. with Commissioners Kenneth Thornton, Ralph Green, Larry Middlebrooks, and Jim Latham present. Judge John Horn was presiding. Jimmy Hamilton, County Auditor was present and Jan Lewis, Chief Deputy, was sitting in for Linda Brooks, County Clerk.

11,390 On the motion by Middlebrooks, second by Latham, the Court approved the minutes from Commissioners' Court held December 28, 2009.

NEW BUSINESS:

11,391 On the motion by Latham, second by Green, the Court approved the quarterly report (Oct-Dec.2009) for the Northeast Texas Children's Museum.

11,392 On the motion by Middlebrooks, second by Green, the Court approved the Judgment Sale of Property ID#74452 for \$1,440.00 plus \$51.23 for 2008 taxes. Property was sold to Michael L. Harper. Deed recorded in Hunt County Real Property Records. *See Attachment.*

11,393 On the motion by Latham, second by Thornton, the Court approved for Hunt County to donate Property ID#79241 (Spencer Addition, Block 5, Lot 1 & 2) to the City of Wolfe City. This property was used in the past for storage of materials for Pct.4 and for "County Cleanups," for Pct. 1 and 4. Wolfe City will be moving their maintenance facility to this property location. Commissioner Latham requested that the donation be made with the stipulation that the County will still have a location to use in Wolfe City for "County Cleanups." The city of Wolfe City agreed to maintain County Cleanups but location of those "Cleanups" may be at their Rodeo grounds due to lack of space on this particular piece of property.

CONSENT AGENDA:

11,394 On the motion by Middlebrooks, second by Thornton, the Court gave consent to initiate the procurement process for the purchase of a drug dog for the Hunt County Sheriff's Office by using donated funds. Lana Adams, Lt.Deputy was present in Court stating that the life of a drug dog is 5 to 7 years and that the current drug dog is in that age group. The secondary dog and training would be paid for with funds that have been donated, as well as other seizure funds, & possibly some contracting funds at no cost to the County. Ms. Adams stated that the

Sheriff's office would like to be able to use the dog in Hunt County schools as well. This will not be a dual purpose dog, but a drug dog only.

11,395 On the motion by Green, second by Thornton, the Court gave consent to transfer one (1) 1995 Chevrolet Caprice Classic Sedan, VIN #1G1BL52P9SR176656, Hunt County #13335, with all attached equipment , from Hunt County Constable Pct. 1 to the Emergency Management/ Fire Marshall's Office. Richard Hill stated the the current car they have was purchased 100% with grant funds and has various stipulations relating to auditing records and what it can be used for. Obtaining this second vehicle, that is a Hunt County vehicle, will make the auditing process much easier when one of the employees needs to be in another location.

11,396 On the motion by Thornton, second by Green, the Court moved to renew the Interlocal Cooperation Contract by and between Hunt County and Lakes Regional MHMR Center for screening outpatient services. *See Attachment.*
