The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00 a.m. with Commissioners Kenneth Thornton, Jay Atkins, Larry Middlebrooks, and Jim Latham present. Judge John Horn was presiding. Jimmy Hamilton, County Auditor and Jennifer Lindenzweig, County Clerk were present. Invocation was given by Commissioner Larry Middlebrooks.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

Ricky Sanders addressed the Court. I have here a letter to the editor from a man in Farmersville that states that our 5 commissioners has guts. I'm not going to question the guts that you have. The thing I question, how much guts does it take to go behind a man's back and cut, target 3 positions in his office. You didn't even tell him, tell the Sheriff what you was gonna do. His deputies knew about it before he did. He didn't find out until Thursday morning that he even had a problem. Now, talk about guts, I've got a question for you, do you have the guts to take on the District Court? I bought up once before about the court appointed attorneys and Judge Horn told me that's set by the district judge in the court, but I believe you have the authority to set that budget and I believe that budget is at least \$200,000.00 over budget. We spent in excess 1.4 million dollars on court appointed attorneys. Then there is a question about the slush fund, money that is set aside for the County to operate and function in the event of emergency. How much money is in that fund and what are you planning to use it for? You asked everybody to cut 5% out of their budget for 5 years, and at the same time Judge Horn's planning on or looking into running for state office. What are we looking at, a bait and switch game or something? Then there's one more thing I have to say. I've been accused of trying to cost this County money because the open records request they've received. I've noticed in the paper where the environmental police brought charges against Redline Raceway, alright, instead of going through our court or district attorney to file the paperwork, you go through Scott, Money, Ray & Thomas

to present paperwork. If there's such a tight strain on money why is it we're not using the attorneys that we're funding instead of outside attorneys on that? I've just got some questions and I just bring it to your attention, and help me out. I guess that's all I have to say right now.

Mr. Hamilton address the issue of the "slush" fund, which the Court refers to as reserve fund and tells Mr. Sanders that he would be happy to go over the budget with him.

Judge Horn states factual information that he has not engaged in any endeavor to aspire to higher office.

Daniel Ray address the policy issue with Redline Raceway and explains that this is not a criminal action and therefore the District Attorney is not being used, and that this is a no cost suit for the County.
