The Hunt County Commissioners Court met this day at 10:00 a.m. with Commissioners Kenneth Thornton, Jay Atkins, Larry Middlebrooks, and Jim Lathan present. Judge John Horn was presiding. Jimmy Hamilton, County Auditor was present and Jan Lewis, Chief Deputy, was sitting in for Jennifer Lindenzweig, County Clerk. Invocation was given by Commissioner Middlebrooks.

12,325 On the motion by Atkins, second by Thornton, the Court approved the minutes as written for April 10, 2012 Regular Session.

## **CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:**

Judge Horn advised the public speaker for today, Mike Lewis, that it has always been the policy of this Court to allow the citizens to be heard, but I want you to understand that this decision is not an entitlement, but is a decision of the Court, and when these presentations become pedantic and repetitive, with no new information, the court reserves the right to not allow this.

Mike Lewis, 4348 CR1101 Celeste, addressed the Court regarding Rails to Trails. Mr. Lewis showed pictures again of portions of the trail that run behind his house. He stated that he thinks cleanup has been taking place in the northwest portion of the county for over a week. He is concerned with seeing no trucks hauling off debris and what appears to be possibly 20 ft. trenches in the back of the trail for debris. He stated that the Environmental people have been called and that they are working on the situation. He is concerned with the digging because of 2 petroleum pipe lines, east of him, and several water lines that run through portions of the property.

### **ADDENDUM:**

11. The proposed RHP 18 with regards to the Healthcare Transformation and Quality Improvement Waiver 1115 – Judge Horn

Rich Carter was present from the Hunt Regional Hospital District to inform the Court of the formation of RHP (Regional Health Partnerships) with the state for indigent healthcare funding.

Mr. Carter stated that he feels the demographics for Hunt County are more suited to the east Texas area and not the suburban Collin, Rockwall, Denton county (possibly RPH 18) areas. The hospital district has organized with Hopkins and Titus hospital districts and has begun the organization of RHP 1. He has proposed to the state, that the hospital district here in Hunt County, be the anchor of the project, and that RHP 1 is preferred because of the funding of the 3 billion dollar a year program. Mr. Carter stated that the counties do not have to make a choice. The County may or may not choose to make a recommendation. The Court decided to take no action on this item.

\_\_\_\_\_The Court then returned to the next scheduled agenda item #5 and #6.
