The building is located on approximately 7.9 acres and meets the Museum's criteria for building space and an outdoor play area. The move from the current location is scheduled for September 2019. The building was previously owned by the Commerce Economic

The Museum has been

working with a month-to-month lease from the Texas A&M University-Commerce since September 2018. We appreciate TAMUC allowing us to stay in the building until another location could be secured. After some discussion concerning being a part of the Agricultural Expo, the timing of vacating the current location and the actual availability of the proposed agricultural complex left few options for the Children's Museum.
