The Hunt County Commissioner's Court met this day at 10:00 a.m. in regular session at 2700 Johnson Street, Greenville, Texas in the Auxiliary Courtroom. Due to technical difficulties, this meeting was postponed until 12:30 pm.

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

This meeting of the Hunt County Commissioner's Court was called to order by Bobby W. Stovall, County Judge, at 12:30 p.m.


